CHARACTERISTICS OF A NON-PROFIT

- An organization set up under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code
- Nonprofit groups with a dedicated mission
- As long as they operate to support their mission, they receive favorable tax treatment, such as avoiding federal income and unemployment taxes
- No earning may inure to any private shareholder or individual
- Includes churches, charities, and private foundations
- It may not attempt to influence legislation as a substantial part of its activities, and it may not participate in any campaign activity for or against political candidates
- Nonprofits exist that are not tax-exempt

 You buy t-shirts for sale, you don't pay sales tax, but you collect sales tax when you sell them.)



10. Action:	Pay Your Taxes! Sales and Use Tax Return, DR-15
File:	Florida DOR Online Payment DR-15
Purpose:	To remit any sales tax collected from sales of goods or services
Note:	Usually paid quarterly
11. Action:	Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, IRS Form 990
File:	File Annual Exempt Status
Purpose:	To inform the IRS and the public about the organization's activities, governance, and finances, ensuring transparency and accountability in the nonprofit sector
Note:	Must be filed annually


